# Toilet Paper Rolls: Creative Time/Writing

Using a toilet paper roll as the base, your challenge is to create a person or animal that will be asked to do various tasks over the weeks as we learn at home.

Materials needed:

1 toilet paper roll (or more if you want)

Various craft materials (paint, markers, buttons, pipe cleaners, fabric etc)

You will need to give your animal or person a name.

In the coming weeks your new buddy will have things to do or find.

Your job will be to write about their adventures (this week we ask that your child do a picture and writing- have your child try to sound out what they are saying)

People create art to express who they are as individuals and community.

Engagement in the arts creates opportunities for inquiry through purposeful play.

Language and story can be a source of creativity and joy.

Two adventures for your mini-friend:

1. build a place to live out of blocks or lego or any other materials of your choosing
